



Downloading and using Tribunal maps in Adobe® Acrobat®

A quick guide

Adobe® Reader® is required to view PDF files. The software is available free of charge from the Adobe® web site at www.adobe.com.

Downloading

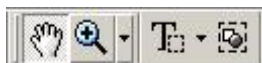
The Adobe® maps available for download from the Tribunals web site are NOT designed for use in the Adobe® web-plugin software.

To download a map, place the cursor over the map name, e.g. NT_NTCA_Schedule.pdf (1.5Mb) and click the right mouse button.

Choose 'Save Target As...' and save the .PDF file to your computer.
View the downloaded .PDF file using the full Adobe® software.

Basic Tools

These tools are required to interact with the map PDF file.



These tools are **Pan**, **Zoom Enlarge**, **Select Text** and **Select Graphics**.

Pan allows you to move the display of the map by 'clicking' and 'dragging'.

Zoom Enlarge enlarges the display in the area selected ('clicking' and 'dragging').

Other tools are also available to zoom out and reposition the display;



Using maps to access information on native title



Maps displaying this symbol allow additional information from the Tribunal's web site to be viewed. The connection is achieved using a link (hyperlink). Web browser software and an internet connection is required.

A link can be accessed using any of the 'Basic Tools' and moving over the map. When a link is detected the cursor will change to a 'W' and the link text will appear.

For example;

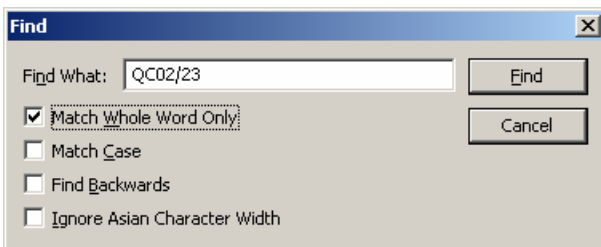

Select on the map with a click of the left mouse button to enact the link and view the resulting information in a web browser.

Searching

Searching can make finding information on a map easy. For example, you may use the name or NNTT number of an application to locate it on the map.

Selecting the search tool  will present the search dialog.



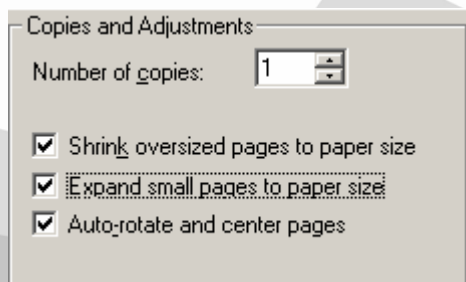
Enter some search criteria and select 'Find'.

When a match is found, the text will be highlighted. Tip: If the text found is in your current view it may still be difficult to locate. If this happens, zoom to a very small area of the map and perform the

search again. The window will focus on the searched item found.

Printing

PDF maps can be printed at any size. National maps are sized for A4 printing, whilst most other maps are large, requiring special hardware to reproduce on a single sheet. To print the map at a size that matches your required page size and printer, enable the following settings in the Print dialog.



Note: If maps are reduced or enlarged the associated text and other information will also be reduced or enlarged. This may make text and features unattractively large or unreadable small.
