Anwerret, Alarilpw, Angkeperretyey, Antarrengeny, Areyn, Arlangkw, Arlpaw, Arnapwenty Imangker, Atnerlelengk, Atnwengerrp, Ileyarn, Irrerlerr, Kwerrkepenty, Lyentyawel Ileparranem, Ntewerrek, Pwerrk and Tyaw landholding groups ('the landholding groups'). Those persons according to the traditional laws acknowledged and customs observed by them:

(a) have spiritual, physical and/or historical associations (as described in Schedule F) with the area described in Schedule B ('the application area') and are connected to the area through:

(i) descent from ancestors (including adoption) connected with the application area as described in paragraph 9(a) below; or

(ii) non-descent based connections as described in paragraphs 9(b) and 11 below;

(b) hold the common or group rights and interests comprising the native title in the application area.

2. The application area is located in part of the territory identified with the Alyawarr and Kaytetye people respectively. The common body of traditional laws acknowledged and customs observed by members of the native title claim group govern how rights and interests in land are acquired and who holds them in particular parts of this territory, including the application area. The nineteen landholding groups which together comprise the native title claim group constitute a community or group whose members hold the common or group rights comprising the native title over the application area as a whole.

3. The application area is located in Alyawarr and Kaytetye linguistic territory. However, under the traditional laws acknowledged and customs observed by members of the native title claim group rights in land are not acquired through membership of a language group. Accordingly, linguistic affiliation or language group identity is not necessarily indicative of a person's connection to particular land and waters.

4. The land and waters associated with an estate group are usually named after a prominent site or place in the estate concerned. The nineteen landholding groups which are named after their respective estate areas are affiliated to the following parts of the application area:

(a) Aharreng (comprising six sub-countries) - Ammaroo Station, central Derry Downs Station and south-central Elkedra Station;

(b) Akaneng - boundary region of Murray Downs and Ammaroo Stations;

(c) Akweranty/Anwerret - western Elkedra Station;

(d) Alarilpw - eastern Elkedra Station;

(e) Angkeperretyey - central-western Ammaroo Station;

(f) Antarrengeny (comprising three sub-countries) - southern Murray Downs Station and northwestern Elkedra Station;

(g) Areyn (comprising five sub-countries) - northern and north-eastern Derry Downs Station and south-eastern Elkedra Station;

(h) Arlangkw - north-eastern Elkedra Station;

(i) Arlpaw - west-central Murray Downs Station;

(j) Arnapwenty Imangker - north-and central Murray Downs Station;

(k) Atnerlelengk - central eastern Murray Downs Station and north-western Elkedra;

(I) Atnwengerrp (comprising four sub-countries) - south-western Ammaroo Station and western Derry Downs Station;

(m) Ileyarn - far north-western Murray Downs Station;

(n) Irrerlerr (comprising three sub-countries) - south-western Derry Downs Station;

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- (o) Kwerrkepenty south-western Murray Downs Station;
- (p) Lyentyawel Ileparranem north-eastern Murray Downs Station;
- (q) Ntewerrek south-eastern Derry Downs Station;
- (r) Pwerrke south-western Murray Downs Station;
- (s) Tyaw- central and northern Elkedra Station.

(b) accepted as members of one (or more) of the estate groups by the senior descent based members of the groups on the basis of their non-descent connections to the estate.

10. The named ancestors in paragraph 9(a) are the uppermost generation of the known ancestors of members of the native title claim group.

11.Under the claimants' system of traditional laws and customs a person who is not descended from the ancestors becomes a member of a landholding group when accepted by the senior descent based members of the group on the basis of non-descent connections to the estate. The non-descent criteria that senior members of a landholding group have regard to when considering the recruitment of a particular individual are:

(a) spiritual identification with and responsibility for an estate;

(b) conception and/or birthplace affiliation with an estate;

(c) long-term residence in an estate;

(d) close kinship ties, including intermarriage;

(e) shared section/subsection and/or moiety affiliation;

(f) a more distant ancestral connection to an estate, for example, mother's father's mother;

(g) possession of secular knowledge of an estate;

(h) possession of traditional religious knowledge, authority and responsibility for an estate;

(i) authority and responsibility for shared Dreaming tracks and/or places of significance connected with an estate;

(j) seniority in traditional matters concerning the claim group and/or the estate. ,

12. The claimants' system of traditional laws and customs includes rules about succession. Traditional succession processes have been recognised in relation to land in the Alyawarr region: see Wakaya/Alyawarre Land Claim, Report No. 34 (1991), paragraphs 5.4, 6.18, 6.19 and 6.20. These processes have occurred in relation to a number of estates in the application area. For example, an area in central-east Derry Downs was formerly affiliated with an estate named Tyapakert. The estate is identified with the Apetyarr/Kngwarrey sections the same section pair affiliation as the neighbouring Aharreng estate. The landholding group had no surviving patri-members and the estate is now acknowledged to be part of the Aharreng estate. Succession has also occurred in relation to Akweranty Anwerret country (Wakaya/Alyawarre Land Claim Report, paragraphs 5.4, 6.19) while Alarilpw estate is being 'looked after' jointly by affiliates of the neighbouring Areyn, Antarrengeny and Aharreng estates in accordance with traditional processes. Additional information about these rules is contained in Schedule F.

13. Under the claimants' system of traditional laws and customs descent is the most important basis for the possession of rights and interests in land. Subject to individual circumstances members of the

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landholding groups who are descended from one of the ancestors possess and transmit a wide range of traditional rights and interests.

14. Under the claimants' system of traditional laws and customs rights and interests in land are inherited through all four grandparental lines. However, members of a landholding group with descent connections through father's father and mother's father are generally able to activate the widest range of rights in relation to the estate.

15. Under the claimants' system of traditional laws and customs the range of rights and interests in land possessed by members of a landholding group who are not descended from the ancestors depends on individual circumstances, including the nature and extent of their non-descent connections to the estate. Generally such rights and interests are not transmittable.

16. A number of members of the native title claim group are members of more than one estate group, for example, due to different grandparental links to multiple estates.

Native title rights and interests claimed:

1. To the extent that any extinguishment of native title rights and interests must be disregarded the native title rights and interests that are claimed in relation to the application area are possession, occupation, use and enjoyment to the exclusion of all others.

2. To the extent that any extinguishment of native title rights and interests is not to be disregarded the native title rights and interests of the native title holders are the rights possessed under and exercisable in accordance with their traditional laws and customs, including the right to conduct activities necessary to give effect to them, being:

(a) the right to access and travel over any part of the land and waters;

(b) the right to live on the land, and for that purpose, to camp, erect shelters and other structures;

(c) the right to hunt, gather and fish on the land and waters;

(d) the right to take and use the natural resources of the land and waters;

(e) the right to access, take and use natural water on or in the land;

(f) the right to light fires for domestic purposes, but not for the clearance of vegetation;

(g) the right to access and to maintain and protect sites and places on or in the land and waters that are important under traditional laws and customs;

(h) the right to conduct and participate in the following activities on the land and waters:

(i) cultural activities;

(ii) ceremonies;

(iii) meetings;

(iv) cultural practices relating to birth and death including burial rites;

(v) teaching the physical and spiritual attributes of sites and places on the land and waters that are important under traditional laws and customs,

and, subject to the rights of any person arising under the laws in force in the Northern Territory to be present on the land, the right to privacy in the exercise and enjoyment of those activities;

(i) the right to speak for country and make decisions about the use and enjoyment of the land and waters by Aboriginal people who recognise themselves to be governed by the traditional laws and customs acknowledged by the native title holders;

(j) the right to share or exchange natural resources obtained on or from the land and waters, including traditional items made from the natural resources;

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(k) the right to be accompanied on the land and waters by persons who, though not native title holders, are:

(i) people required by traditional law and custom for the performance of ceremonies or cultural activities on the land and waters;

(ii) people who have rights in relation to the land and waters according to the traditional laws and customs acknowledged by the native title holders;

(iii) people required by the native title holders to assist in, observe, or record traditional activities on the areas.

3. Subject to paragraph 1 and the operation of the non-extinguishment principle where it applies all the rights and interests listed in paragraph 2 above existed and continue to exist in relation to the application area as a whole.

4. Unless any extinguishment of native title rights and interests must be disregarded the native title rights and interests claimed do not confer possession, occupation, use and enjoyment of the application area to the exclusion of all others.

5. The applicant acknowledges that the native title rights and interests are subject to and exercisable in accordance with valid laws of the Northern Territory of Australia and the Commonwealth of Australia.

6. The common or group rights and interests comprising the native title are held by the members of the landholding groups that together comprise the native title claim group over the application area as a whole. However, the distribution of rights and interests within the group and in respect of different parts of the application area is governed by the claimants' system of traditional laws and customs, including:

(a) the particular association that members of the native title claim group have with one or more of the landholding groups and their respective estate areas; and

(b) individual circumstances, including age, gender, knowledge, and physical and mental capacity.

7. The activities referred to in Schedules G and M were and are undertaken in the exercise of the native title rights and interests set out in paragraph 2.
