Description of the Area covered by the application



NSD168/2011 - Yaegl People #2 - Part B - Sea Claim

The area subject to this application covers all land and waters within the external boundary described below:

External Boundary Description

Commencing at the intersection of the Mean High Water Mark of the South Pacific Ocean and the southern bank of Wooli River and extending generally northerly, generally north westerly and again generally northerly along that Mean High Water Mark, crossing the mouths of any waterways between the seaward extremities of each of the opposite banks of each such waterway to a point on the north eastern boundary of Wooded Bluff (Shark Bay) at Longitude 153.362980° East; then due east to a point on a 200m buffer east from the Mean Low Water Mark; then generally southerly along a 200m buffer east of the Mean Low Water Mark to intersect a northern boundary of a 350m buffer of a line joining the following coordinate points:

Then generally north easterly, generally southerly and generally westerly and generally north westerly along the boundary of that 350m buffer to its intersection with again the 200m buffer east of the Mean Low Water Mark; then again generally southerly along that 200m buffer to Latitude 29.887037° South; then westerly back to the commencement point.

Reference datum
