Native title rights and interests claimed:

The native title rights and interests claimed in relation to the area covered by the application are:

- (a) the right to possess, occupy, use and enjoy the land and waters of the area covered by the application to the exclusion of all others, including the right to:
- (i) live on the area covered by the application;
- (ii) make decisions about the use and enjoyment of the area covered by the application;
- (iii) hunt and gather, and to take the waters for the purpose of satisfying the native title claim group's personal, domestic, social, cultural, religious, spiritual, ceremonial and communal needs;
- (iv) control access to, and activities conducted by others on, the land and waters of the area covered by the application;
- (v) maintain and protect sites and areas which are of significance to the members of the native title claim group under their traditional laws and customs:
- (vi) as against any other Aboriginal group or individual to be acknowledged as the traditional Aboriginal owners of the area covered by the application;
- (vii) trade in resources of the area;
- (viii) receive a portion of any resources taken by others from the area;
- (ix) maintain, protect and prevent the misuse of cultural knowledge of the common law holders associated with the area:

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- (x) possess the land water and resources;
- (xi) occupy the land water and resources;
- (xii) use and enjoy the land, waters and resources;
- (xiii) own and control knowledge and information comprising and concerning the traditional laws customs of the native title holders in relation to the land and waters and resources and the passing of this knowledge on to younger generations;
- (xiv) bear, rear and teach children on the land;
- (xv) conduct ceremonies on and for the land waters and resources and to attend sites of cultural and religious significance;
- (xvi) erect residences and other infrastructure on the land, move freely about the land and waters including camping and seeking shelter;
- (xvii) collect food from the land and waters;
- (xviii) take and use the resources of the land including water plants medicines animals fisheries forest products and all other components and attributes of the land;
- (xix) take from the land and waters and use all minerals and ores including extractive and quarry minerals such as flints clay soil sand gravel rock and like resources;
- xx) manufacture materials artefacts tools and weapons from the products of the land waters and resources;
- (xxi) dispose of products of the land waters and resources and manufactured product by trade or exchange;
- (xxii) manage conserve and look after the land waters and resources including locating and cleaning water sources and drinking water on the land;
- (xxiii) manipulate the environment by burning the land, harvesting produce, sowing seed and doing other like activities:
- (xxiv) grant or refuse permission to any person to do some of all of subparagraphs (i) (xxiii) above inclusive either at all or subject to terms and conditions;
- (xxv) inherit native title rights and interests;
- (xxvi) bestow and acquire native title rights and interests;
- (xxvii) resolve amongst themselves any disputes concerning land, waters and resources;
- (xxviii) regulate access to parts of the land according to initiation status and gender and otherwise to exclude strangers from the land;
- (xxix) permit persons other than native title holders to enter the land; and
- (xxx) exclude person other than native titleholders from the land;
- (b) the right to use the following traditionally accessed resources:
- (i)ochre;
- (ii) soils;
- (iii) rocks and stones; and
- (iv) flora and fauna,

for the purpose of satisfying their personal, domestic, social, cultural, religious, spiritual, ceremonial and communal needs; and

(c) the right to take, use and enjoy the flowing and subterranean waters in accordance with their traditional laws and customs for personal, domestic, social, cultural, religious, spiritual, ceremonial and communal needs, including the right to hunt on and gather and fish from the flowing and subterranean water.

All those lands and waters commencing from the westernmost northwestern corner of Unallocated Crown Land being Lot 4 on Department of Land Information Deposited Plan 220354 and extending easterly, northerly and again easterly along boundaries of that lot to the westernmost northwestern corner of Unallocated Crown Land being Lot 3 on Department of Land Information Deposited Plan 220354; Thence generally easterly, northerly, easterly, southerly and easterly along boundaries of that lot to Longitude 122.000000 East; Thence due south to Latitude 25.600000 South; Thence due east to Longitude 122.100000 East; Thence due north to a northern boundary of Unallocated Crown Land being Lot 3 on Department of Land Information Deposited Plan 220354; Thence easterly, southerly, westerly, again southerly and again westerly along boundaries of that lot to the southernmost southeastern corner of Unallocated Crown Land being Lot 4 on Department of Land Information Deposited Plan 220354; Thence westerly, northerly, again westerly and again northerly along boundaries of that lot back to the commencement point.

Part A(2)

All those lands and waters commencing from the westernmost northwestern corner of Unallocated Crown Land being Lot 27 on Department of Land Information Deposited Plan 220011 and extending easterly, northerly and generally easterly along boundaries of that lot to the westernmost corner of Unallocated Crown Land being Lot 8 on Department of Land Information Deposited Plan 220011; Thence easterly and southerly along boundaries of that lot to a northeastern corner of Unallocated Crown Land being Lot 27 on Department of Land Information Deposited Plan 220011; thence southerly, easterly and again southerly along boundaries of that lot to Latitude 26.198661 South; Thence westerly to Longitude 121.584723 East, Latitude 26.198662 South; Thence due south to Latitude 26.248662 South; Thence due east to a eastern boundary of Unallocated Crown Land being Lot 27 on Department of Land Information Deposited Plan 220011; Thence southerly generally westerly, northerly, westerly, northwesterly and northerly along boundaries of that lot back to the commencement point.

- (iii) Category B past acts that are wholly inconsistent with the continued existence, enjoyment or exercise of any native title rights or interests;
- (iv) Category B intermediate period acts that are wholly inconsistent with the continued existence, enjoyment or exercise of any native title rights or interests;
- (b) any area in relation to which a 'relevant act', as that term is defined in section 12I of the Titles (Validation) and Native Title (Effect of Past Acts) Act 1995 (WA), was done and the act is attributable to the State of Western Australia;
- (c) any area in relation to which a previous exclusive possession act, under section 12J of the Titles (Validation) and Native Title (Effect of Past Acts) Act 1995 (WA), was done and that act is attributable to the State of Western Australia:
- (d) any area in relation to which a previous exclusive possession act, as defined by section 23B (including section 23B(7)) of the Native Title Act 1993 (Cth), was done in relation to the area and that act was attributable to the Commonwealth;
- (e) any areas where native title rights and interests have otherwise been wholly extinguished; and
- (f) specifically, any areas where there has been:
- (i) any unqualified grant of any estate in fee simple;
- (ii) a lease which is currently in force, in respect of an area not exceeding 5000 square metres, upon which a dwelling house, residence, building or work is constructed, and which comprises:
- (A) a lease of a worker's dwelling under the Worker's Homes Act 1911-1928;
- (B) 999 year lease under the Land Act 1898 (WA);
- (C) a lease of a town lot or suburban lot pursuant to section 117 of the Land Act 1933 (WA);
- (D) a special lease under section 117 of the Land Act 1933 (WA);
- (E) any reserves vested pursuant section 33 of the Land Act 1933 (WA) that are not for the benefit of Aboriginal people;
- (iii) a conditional purchase lease currently in force in the Agricultural areas of the South West Division under regulations 46 and 47 of the Land Regulations 1887 which includes a condition that the lessee reside on the area of the lease and upon which a residence has been constructed;
- (iv) a conditional purchase lease of cultivatable land currently in force under Part V, Division (1) of the Land Act 1933 (WA) in respect of which habitual residence by the lessee is a statutory condition in accordance with the Division and upon which a residence has been constructed;
- (v) a perpetual lease currently in force under the War Service Land Settlement Scheme Act 1954;
- (vi) a public work as defined in section 253 of the Native Title Act 1993 (Cth); or
- (vii) an existing dedicated public road.

Part C: Applicability of sections 61A(4) and 47B

- 2. For the purposes of the application of sections 61A(4) and 47B of the Native Title Act 1993 (Cth), the application covers the entirety of area within the external boundary described under Part A above.
- 3. Where an act specified in Part B sub-paragraphs 1(a) to (f), above, affects or affected land or waters referred to in section 47B of the Native Title Act 1993 (Cth), the area covered by the act is not excluded from the application.
- 4. For the avoidance of doubt, the Applicant seeks to have section 47B apply to the entire area within the external boundary of the application described in Part A above and shown on the map provided at Attachment C.
