

WAD293/2005 Kulyakartu (WC2005/007) – Remaining Area

External boundary description

The remaining application area covers all the land and waters within the external boundary described as:

That part of Petroleum Exploration Permit EP 448 (as defined by Department of Mines and Petroleum as at 4th December 2015) south of the southern boundary of Native Title Determination WAD6281/1998 Nyangumarta People (Part A) (WC1998/065), further described as:

a line joining Longitude 123.340954° East, Latitude 21.021841° South and the north eastern boundary of Native Title Determination WAD6110/98 Martu (Part A) (WC96/078) (*being the line joining Longitude 122.751315 ° East, Latitude 20.748621 South and Longitude 123.167985 ° East, Latitude 21.165289 South*) at Longitude 122.841718° East.
