External boundary description

The amended application area covers all the land and waters within the external boundary described as:

Commencing at the north westernmost corner of Reserve 25051 and extending south easterly to the north easternmost corner of Pastoral Lease 3114/854; then southerly, easterly, again southerly and again easterly along the western boundary of Reserve 36271 to the easternmost north eastern corner of Reserve 20396; then southerly along the eastern boundary of that reserve to Latitude 28.401234° South; then westerly along that latitude to a western boundary of Reserve 25050; then north westerly, westerly and northerly along boundaries of that reserve to a southern boundary of Reserve 22032; then westerly, northerly, easterly, again northerly and generally easterly along boundaries of that reserve to a western boundary of again Reserve 25051; then northerly along the western boundary of that reserve back to the commencement point.

The following areas are excluded from the application area:

Lot 49 DP92113 (Reserve 18594), Lot 51 DP 92114 (Reserve 18595), Lot 53 DP92115 (Reserve 18596), Lot 54 DP 92116 (Reserve 18597) and Lot 8 DP194109.

Reference datum
