External boundary description

The application area covers all the land and waters within the external boundary described as:

That portion of Unallocated Crown Land, formerly Pastoral Lease 595/98, described as:

All those lands and waters commencing at Longitude 124.002275° East, Latitude 18.962419° South being a point on the boundary of Native Title Determination WAD6077/1998 Ngurrara Part A (WCD2007/005) and extending easterly along that native title determination to the intersection with Petroleum Title EP 431 R1 (as at 28 May 2018) at Longitude 124.084611° East; then southerly and westerly along boundaries of that petroleum title to the intersection of a western boundary of again Native Title Determination WAD6077/1998 Ngurrara Part A (WCD2007/005) at Longitude 124.002275° East; then northerly along that boundary back to the commencement point.

For the avoidance of doubt the application excludes the following:

- Native Title Determination WAD6077/98 Ngurrara Part A (WCD2007/005) as determined by the Federal Court on 09 November 2007.

Reference datum
