

WAD460/2018 - Nangaanya-ku Part A (WCD2021/009) – Remaining application area

This description is an interpretation of the application area that remains undetermined following the determination of native title by the Federal Court of Australia on 29 November 2021 for WAD460/2018 - Nangaanya-ku Native Title Claim Group (Part A) (WCD2021/009).

External boundary description

The remaining application area covers all the land and waters within the external boundary described as:

- Mining Lease M39/1096; and
- That part of Mining Lease M39/0139 that falls east of the Unallocated Crown Land boundary approximated by the line joining Longitude 123.124112 East, Latitude 29.236038 South and Longitude 123.124110 East, Latitude 29.014169 South.

Mining Leases as defined by the Department of Mines, Industry Regulation and Safety as at 9 October 2018.

Reference datum
