The application area covers all the land and waters within the external boundary described as:

Commencing at the intersection of the northern boundary of the Douglas Shire Council Local Government Authority area and the western boundary of Lot 212 on Plan SP154458 (Ngalba Bulal National Park), also being a western boundary of part of Native Title Determination QUD6008/1998 Eastern Kuku Yalanji People (QCD2007/002) at Latitude 15.957013° South and extending southerly and generally easterly along the western and southern boundaries of that native title determination to the intersection with a southern boundary of the North Queensland, Representative Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Body (RATSIB) area at Longitude 145.209184° East; then westerly and generally southerly along the boundary of that RATSIB area to the intersection with an eastern boundary of again part of Native Title Determination QUD6008/1998 - Eastern Kuku Yalanji People (QCD2007/002) at Latitude 16.030162° South; then generally northerly, westerly, and generally south easterly and generally north easterly along the boundaries of that Native Title Determination, crossing the Daintree River where Boolbun Creek meets that river, to the easternmost north eastern corner of Lot 71 on Plan SP224299; then north easterly to the centreline of the Daintree River, at Longitude 145.308717° East; then generally easterly along the centreline of that river to its mouth at the Mean High Water of Trinity Bay; then generally southerly along that Mean High Water Mark to a northern corner of part of Native Title Determination QUD6008/1998 Eastern Kuku Yalanji People (QCD2007/002) at approximate Latitude 16.315682° South; then westerly, south westerly and generally easterly along that determination boundary to again the Mean High Water Mark at approximate Latitude 16.328538° South; then generally southerly along that High Water Mark to the northernmost corner of Lot 86 on Plan SP104236, also being a northern corner of part of Native Title Determination QUD6008/1998 Eastern Kuku Yalanji People (QCD2007/002); then westerly, generally southerly and easterly along that determination boundary to again the Mean High Water Mark; then general southerly along that High Water Mark to the south eastern corner of Lot 1 on Plan USL8683; then south westerly to a point on the western boundary of the Central Coastal Creeks sub catchment area within the Mossman River Catchment at Latitude 16.481373° South; then generally south easterly and generally southerly along the western boundaries of that sub-catchment area and the sub-catchment area of the Lower Mowbray of the Mowbray River Catchment to the centreline of the Mowbray River; then generally south easterly along the centreline of that river to Latitude 16.570155° South; then generally south westerly passing through the following coordinate points:

Then south westerly to a point on the south western boundary of the Mossman River Catchment area at Longitude 145.409581° East; then generally westerly, generally northerly and generally westerly along the western boundaries of that catchment area to the intersection with the northern boundary of Douglas Shire Council Local Government Authority area at Longitude 145.371771° East; then generally south easterly, generally north westerly and generally northerly along western boundaries of that Local Government Authority boundary to the southernmost corner of former Lot 6 on Plan USL8931 at Latitude 16.468906° South, also being a corner of part of Native Title Determination QUD6008/1998 Eastern Kuku Yalanji People (QCD2007/002); then north easterly and generally north westerly and generally westerly along the eastern and northern boundaries of that determination boundary to again the Douglas Shire Council Local Government Area boundary at Longitude 145.215596° East; then generally north westerly, generally north easterly, generally north easterly, along the western boundaries of that Local Government Authority area back to the commencement point.

Exclusions

This application excludes all land and water subject to Native Title Determination QUD6008/1998 - Eastern Kuku Yalanji People (QCD2007/002) as determined by the Federal Court of Australia on 9 December 2007. In particular, Lots 21, 23-24, 26-30, 34 and 36-49 on AP14233, being those parts of the determination that fall within the external boundary described above.
