



Schedule 3 – External Boundary

The external boundary is comprised of, together, the areas of lands and waters described as Area A (Northern Area) and Area B (Southern Area) below.

Area A - Northern Area

The area of land and waters:

Commencing at the south western corner of Lot 473 on SP206203 (Harkness) and the southern boundary of Kowanyama People Part B Native Title determination area (QCD2012/016); then southerly until the junction of the Alice River and Crosbie Creek, then southerly a short distance until the intersection with the southern bank of the Alice River, also being the northern boundary of Lot 13 on CTH3 (Koolatah) and Kowanyama People Part B Native Title Determination (QCD2012/016), at Longitude 142.41808° East, then generally north westerly along the southern bank of the Alice River and the northern boundaries of Lot 13 on CTH3 (Koolatah) and Lot 5 on SP215744 (Errk Oygangand National Park (CYPAL)) until a point at Longitude 142.119391° East; then north easterly a short distance until the intersection with an internal boundary of Lot 12 on CTH804427 (Oriners), also being the western boundary of an unnamed road corridor; then north easterly along that internal lot boundary until the intersection with the southern boundary of Lot 4695 on PH1656 (Balurga) and Kowanyama People Part B Native Title determination area (QCD2012/016); then north easterly and easterly along the southern boundaries of that lot and determination until the point of commencement.

Area B - Southern Area

The area of land and waters:

Commencing at the junction of the centrelines of the Mitchell River and Palmer River, also being the intersecting corner point of the boundaries of Cook Shire Local Government Area, Carpentaria Shire Local Government Area and Mareeba Shire Local Government Area, and a point on the southern boundary of the Cape York Land Council Native Title Representative Body Area; then south easterly and southerly along the boundaries of the Carpentaria Shire Local Government Area and the Cape York Land Council Native Title Representative Body Area until the intersection with the south western bank of the Mitchell River at Latitude 16.112022° South, also being the eastern boundary of Kowanyama People Part B Native Title Determination



(QCD2012/016) and Lot 3 on MM2 (Dunbar); then generally north westerly and northerly along the boundaries of that determination until a point at Latitude 15.790683° South, which may also described as:

then generally north westerly along the south-western bank of the Mitchell River and eastern boundary of Lot 3 on MM2 (Dunbar); then northerly along the eastern boundary of Dunbar Station; then north easterly and northerly along the eastern boundaries of Lot 13 on CTH3 (Koolatah) until a point at Latitude 15.790683° South;

then southerly and south easterly until the intersection with the southern boundary of the Cook Shire Local Government Area and the Cape York Land Council Native Title Representative Body Area near Windermere Lagoon at Longitude 142.801773° East, passing through the following coordinate points:

then generally westerly along the southern boundaries of the Cook Shire Local Government Area and Cape York Land Council Native Title Representative Body Area until the point of commencement.
