**Condition/s on authority:**

Taungurung People, as a group, authorised the Applicant to make the present application and deal with matters arising in relation to it, subject to the following conditions.

1. The Applicant is authorised to make decisions by a majority of the persons who from time to time comprise the Applicant.
2. Each member of the Applicant represents Taungurung People as a whole, not their individual family or descent group.
3. Any moneys payable to or received by the Applicant, or a member of the Applicant in his or her capacity as a member of the Applicant, must be paid into:  
(a) an account with an "authorised deposit-taking institution" (within the meaning of the *Banking Act 1959* (Cth)) operated by, or on trust for, the Applicant; or  
(b) the trust account of a "law practice" under the *Legal Profession Uniform Law* (Vic).
4. The Applicant has no authority to make any decisions about particular land and waters within the Claim Area including any decisions to enter into agreements under s.31 of the NTA;
5. The Applicant has no authority to make any decision to approve any consent determination or enter into an agreement under ss.87 or 87A of the NTA;
6. Subject to paragraph [3] above, the Applicant has no authority to make any decisions about payment of money or transfer of any moneys received by the Applicant on behalf of Taungurung People other than to pay the reasonable and necessary costs of operating an account or paying funds into a trust account in accordance with paragraph [3] above.
7. Decisions about the matters set out in [3] above must be made by the Taungurung People as a group at a publicly notified meeting at which resolutions are passed in accordance with an agreed decision-making process.

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**DESCRIPTION OF THE AREA COVERED BY THE CLAIM:**

**The area covered by the application**

1. Subject to the [2]-[5] below, the application area covers all the land and waters within the Taungurung Land and Waters Council Aboriginal Corporation Registered Aboriginal Party Boundary (**Claim Area**). A written description of the outer boundary of the Claim Area is provided as **Schedule B Attachment**.

**Areas within the boundary of the application that are not covered by the application**

2. Subject to [3], [4] and [5] below the areas of land and waters within the boundary referred to in [1] above that are not covered by the application are:

(a) any area that is, or was, subject to any of the following acts as defined in the *Native Title Act 1993* (Cth) (**NTA**) or the *Land Titles Validation Act 1994* (Vic):

- i. Category A past acts;
  - ii. Category A intermediate period acts;
  - iii. Category B past acts that are wholly inconsistent with the continued existence of any native title rights or interests;
  - iv. Category B intermediate period acts that are wholly inconsistent with the continued existence of any native title rights or interests;
  - v. Previous exclusive possession acts;
- (b) any other area in relation to which native title rights and interest have otherwise been validly wholly extinguished;
- (c) any area for which there is an approved determination of native title, as defined in the NTA.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained elsewhere in this application, the area covered by the application includes any area in relation to which the non-extinguishment principle (as defined in section 238 of the NTA) applies, including any area to which section 47, 47A or 47B of the NTA applies.

4. Where there is any discrepancy between the map provided at Schedule C and the written description contained in the Schedule B Attachment, the latter prevails.

5. For the avoidance of any doubt, the application excludes any area subject to:

(a) Native Title Determination VID6001/1995 Yorta Yorta (VCD1998/001) as determined in the Federal Court on 18 December 1998.

(b) Native Title Determination VID6007/1998, VID482/2009 Gunai/Kurnai People (VCD2010/001) as determined in the Federal Court on 22 October 2010.

#### **PERSONS CLAIMING TO HOLD NATIVE TITLE:**

The application is made on behalf of the Taungurung People (the **native title claim group**). The Taungurung People are those Aboriginal persons who:

(a) descend by birth, or adoption in accordance with the traditional laws acknowledged and the traditional customs observed by the Taungurung People, from one or more of the following Taungurung apical ancestors (listed in alphabetical order):

(b) identify as Taungurung persons; and

(c) are recognised and accepted as Taungurung persons in accordance with the traditional laws acknowledged and the traditional customs observed by the Taungurung People.

#### **REGISTERED NATIVE TITLE RIGHTS AND INTERESTS:**

##### **The following Native Title Rights & Interests were entered on the Register on 31/03/2026**

A description of the native title rights and interests claimed in relation to particular land or waters is set out below.

##### **Exclusive Native Title**

1. Paragraph [2] applies to every part of the Claim Area where there has been no extinguishment to any extent of native title rights and interests or where any such extinguishment is to be disregarded pursuant to sections 47, 47A, 47B or 47C of the NTA.

2. Where this paragraph applies, the native title rights and interests possessed under traditional laws and customs confer the right to possession, occupation, use and enjoyment of the land and waters of the relevant part of the Claim Area to the exclusion of all others.

##### **Non-Exclusive Native Title**

3. Paragraph [4] applies to every part of the Claim Area to which paragraph [2] does not apply.

4. Where this paragraph applies, the native title rights and interests possessed under traditional laws and customs confer the right to:

- (a) access, remain on and use the land and waters;
- (b) access, take or use the resources of the land and waters; and
- (c) access, maintain and protect places, areas and things of significance under traditional laws and customs; and to the extent only that the following rights are not described by the rights in subparagraphs (a), (b) or (c) of this paragraph [4], the native title rights and interests confer the right to:
- (d) live on the land;
- (e) erect shelters or other structures on the land;
- (f) hunt, fish and gather on the land and waters of the area;
- (g) light fires on the area and conduct burning in accordance with traditional laws and customs;
- (h) conduct ceremonies and maintain intangible spiritual and cultural connections to the land and waters of the area;

- (i) teach on the area the physical and unbroken intangible spiritual connections of the land and waters;
- (j) hold meetings on the area;
- (k) undertake cultural practices relating to birth and death, including burial rites; and
- (l) take the water and the natural resources of the land and waters of the area.

5. For the avoidance of doubt, nothing in the rights described in [4](d)-(l) above limits the meaning of the rights as set out in [4](a)-(c) above.

6. The native title rights are subject to, and exercisable in accordance with:

- (a) the traditional laws and customs of the native title claim group; and
- (b) the laws of the State of Victoria and the Commonwealth of Australia, including the common law.

**Matters to which native title rights do not apply**

7. There is no native title in the Claim Area in or in relation to:

- (a) minerals as defined in the *Mineral Resources (Sustainable Development) Act 1990 (Vic)*, as presently in force, as are owned by the Crown;
- (b) petroleum as defined in the *Petroleum Act 1998 (Vic)*, as presently in force, as is owned by the Crown; and
- (c) groundwater as defined in the *Water Act 1989 (Vic)*, as presently in force.

**Area Covered by the native title and who holds the rights**

8. Each of the native title rights and interests referred to in paragraphs [2] and [4] above exist in relation to that part of the Claim Area to which those paragraphs respectively apply and are held, and exercisable by, the members of the native title claim group subject to and in accordance with traditional law and customs.
